Featherock is a many splendored thing. Shown above, natural pumice complements the exotic bloom of the bromeliad. For taller growing plants add a top layer of nursery moss to cover the potting soil and help retain moisture. Use a drip tray to protect table tops.

For house plants Featherrock is a planter. For dry or artificial plants or flowers it becomes a vase.

For Landscaping

Featherrock garden planters begin as a rare gift of nature. Their parent is a Featherrock boulder – a distinctive lightweight stone of volcanic origin. In striking colors of silver gray and charcoal, these boulders are available at your Featherrock dealer in many sizes and shapes. You can easily carve and hollow them out without special tools. They make a perfect home for a wide variety of container plants. Transplant or place your nursery container “as is” in the planter cavity. Camouflage the nursery container with nursery moss.

Our landscape cover photo features a “naturalized” version of the traditional terra cotta jar with strawberry pockets. Here a chrysanthemum cascades from a four foot silver gray Featherrock boulder-planter bordered by smaller Featherrock boulders.

For the Show

Architectural pottery and matching hardscapes are made for each other. Featherrock garden planters go naturally wherever you want them. Each one is an original. Each one lends a special and supportive character to its living occupant whether it be a flowering plant, evergreen, tropical, alpine or desert succulent. Place them to show – in entries, along driveways, on decks and terraces, around pools and ponds. Hang them from a beam or wall bracket. Singly and in clusters they bring color and a natural touch to regimented surroundings.

Ordinary stone is heavy, suitable only for ground placement. Featherrock planters are light. Light enough to entertain a roof garden. Light enough to move with the seasons to a sunny or sheltered place. They are weatherproof and require no maintenance.

For the Hearth

Remember grandmother’s fresh vegetable-herb garden and those savory country home meals? Herbal gardening was meant for confined places be it a window box, balcony or tiny ground patch in your backyard. Many of the plants are small and thrive in pots – or in a novel and original Featherrock planter. Herbs like fragrant thyme shown here in topiary styling can be rewarding.

Featherrock planters pictured in this brochure are 12-18 inches in size and weigh 15-18 lbs. To make one, shape or flatten a Featherrock boulder bottom with a hand ax. With hammer and chisel hollow out a cavity topside roughly 6 x 6 inches in diameter and depth, smoothing the interior with a rasp. For drainage, drill a hole through the bottom.
